### **BACKGROUND**

The next two years will be crucial in shaping an open, free, and secure digital future for all through the Global Digital Compact. To be truly inclusive, a human-centric and gender-transformative approach is imperative. Although the gender digital divide persists, with 69 per cent of all men are using the Internet compared with 63 per cent of all women (ITU, 2022), gender perspectives remain largely absent from the policymaking process: the current digital policy environment is mostly gender-blind and women are underrepresented in decision-making processes. Highlevel female leadership in policymaking has the potential to influence the entire digital ecosystem and make economic and socio-political opportunities accessible to everyone.

### **EVENT DESCRIPTION**

In the spirit of the CSW67 priority theme, Germany and the ITU join forces to bridge the gender digital divide. In the side event, panellists and participants will explore how gender-inclusive digital policy can change (digital) development outcomes, what is needed to do so and particularly, what role female leadership in the digital sector can and should play. Germany and the ITU will kick off the Network of Women Digital Ministers, which is to be a platform for exchange and joint advocacy to enhance the representation, participation, and leadership of women in global policymaking processes in the digital sector seeking to promote more inclusive digital policies and to set standards for an accessible, safe, and gender-equal digital transformation. Moreover, ITU and EIF will launch the forthcoming Handbook on Mainstreaming Gender in Digital Policies.
